

INCLEMENT WEATHER / HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS

The winter season is upon us. Our administrators understand that a decision to open or close schools in bad weather has a major effect on families. We also believe that our students are better served in their academic and career technical programs by being in school. Having stated that, our top priority remains the safety of our students and staff.

HOW DO WE MAKE OUR DECISIONS?

The Warren County Career Center Superintendent, Director of Secondary Education and Director of Adult Education consult with our partner districts – Franklin, Kings, Lebanon, Little Miami, Springboro and Waynesville – and when at least four of the six districts have made the decision to close schools, WCCC also closes. Our Adult Education Director makes the decision to close evening classes if inclement weather is moving into the area during the day and looks like it would be prohibitive to safe travel that evening. Other organizations that use our building also follow our closing schedule.

WHAT ARE THE POSSIBLE DECISIONS?

Schools Closed: Classes will not be in session. If it applies to Adult Education, it will be announced separately.

One-Hour Delay (in school starting time): High School students will arrive one hour later. If you hear a one hour delay, you should continue to monitor your TV/radio and our website, since changing conditions could warrant a later announcement of closing schools.

Early Dismissal: The High School and/or Adult Education will dismiss early with the time specified in a media announcement. Midday snowstorms or hazardous conditions create different problems.

HOW IS THE PUBLIC NOTIFIED?

The best way is to check our website (www.mywccc.org) for information. School closings or delays will be posted at the top of the front page. You can also tune to local TV and radio outlets for up-to-date information on school closings.

WHEN IS THE DECISION MADE?

The decision will be made as early as possible in order to notify radio and TV stations and post the decision on our website. Please keep in mind 4 of our 6 partner schools must be closed or delayed before we typically make our decision regarding high school closing.
