The resource coordinator provides individual and group support, various social services, and community referrals for WCCC students and their families. Students may request services or may be referred by staff, families or others in the community. The Resource Coordinator provides one-on-one supportive counseling to students. Many support groups are offered to students covering diverse areas such as smoking cessation and grief. WCCC hosts a student-supported Drug and Alcohol prevention program through Teen Institute. Community referrals are often made in several areas to meet student needs. Some referrals include counseling, food pantries, clothing, pregnancy support, and drug assessment and treatment services.

Teen Institute (TI): A drug free teen leadership group open to all students. TI is involved in drug and alcohol education for themselves and their school. TI also addresses various life issues facing youth today. We have brought in several speakers both inspirational for success, and against drunk driving. They have been involved in many community service projects such as a food drive and a clothing drive. They assisted in running a mock car accident during prom week.

Grief Recovery Group: Hospice of Dayton co-leads this grief recovery group for students who struggle with the loss of someone in their lives. Individual grief counseling has also been provided through Hospice.

Ala-teen Group: An anonymous group that supports students who struggle with family members involved in abusing drugs and/or alcohol. This group is open to all students.

Smoking Cessation Group: This group is supported through the NOT program and the Tobacco- Free Healthy Communities Coalition. Open to students with a desire to stop smoking. Also provides the opportunity for students to be involved in Tobacco compliance related to the sale of tobacco products to minors.

Anger Management Group: This group is offered with the assistance of the School Works Program through Warren County Mental Health. Students with anger management issues are referred through school staff to participate in this group.

Parenting Group: This group is offered to both male and female students who are expecting to be or are currently parents. Students often earn products for their children. Several community services are also available to our pregnant teens.

Student Needs Cupboard: Various donations from the community are accepted and distributed through this project. Clothing, school supplies, hygiene products, and parenting supplies are all offered to students in need. All donations are appreciated.

Tutoring/Mentoring: Volunteers through Retired Senior Volunteer Program are available during school to assist students with academic needs and/or support/life choices. This service is open to all students.

Counseling: Various community services provide counseling services that cover many areas at WCCC. Cancer Family Care provides counseling for students with terminally ill family members. Hospice of Dayton provides grief counseling. The Rape and Crisis Shelter provide support for victims of sexual assault or domestic violence. Mental Health's School Works program provides general counseling for multiple needs. Referrals are also made for counseling in the community. Students are referred from various sources for these services.

Teen Pregnancy Resources: Many community services provide for the needs of pregnant teens. Various donations are available at WCCC.

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
