

Student Schedule First Quarter 2020

WCCC has decided that we will remain in a hybrid model of instruction for the first quarter of the school year. Students will split time on campus for their career tech labs. Additionally, we are moving to remote learning experiences for academics. This is to ensure that we have a smaller amount of students on campus each day as we transition to having students on campus. The schedule will look like this:

For the first quarter, students are split into two groups (Group A & Group B) and were notified of their group the week before the first day of school. Face to Face learning will take place in the CT lab only; including breakfast and lunch. All academic learning will take place remotely/online. They will also have support from their Intervention Specialist if on an IEP. Daily attendance will be taken for face to face learning. Students may be pulled out from lab for one-to one remediation while on campus.

Students will be expected to attend MEET sessions on off-campus days for academics (schedule MEET and CT Wednesday). This will be very structured and closely monitored for students to participate and complete course work. Academics will provide support to students with disabilities, and other students as needed.

The pandemic demands we begin the 2020-21 school year in an unprecedented way—including new health protocols, physical distancing, and more. We are preparing to deliver our students' education through whatever model is necessary because of our hands-on focus. No matter the delivery model of our lessons this fall our focus will be that our students will be able to earn certifications and industry credentials in their chosen fields. Students must wear a mask or face shield while on campus.

In the unfortunate event the state or local health department requires us to shut down our campuses due to the pandemic (Purple Level 4 Warning), we will administer remote learning opportunities until we can safely reopen our campuses and continue the hands-on portion of WCCC career tech programming. We know that the majority of families want as much in-person instruction as is safely possible, and we will work to maximize it at every turn, consistent with health and safety requirements. We will continue to give our students what they need to excel, especially in a time of crisis. Our plans must be nimble so we can adjust and update as needed, as the public health landscape continues to evolve. Please remember that this guidance may change as public health conditions evolve.
